Are you up to date with your bowel, breast and cervical screening tests?

Participation in regular breast, bowel and cervical cancer screening gives you and your loved ones the best chance of detecting cancer early and ultimately, saving lives.

Cancer screening rates in regional areas often fall below the South Australian average, specifically in the Outback North and East, Limestone Coast, Mid North and Murray Mallee regions.

Participation in cancer screening programs is vital for people living in regional and remote South Australia where access to treatment can be limited and the burden of cancer is often higher.

Did you know that the five year survival rate of breast cancer is 91 per cent and around 90 per cent of bowel cancers treated successfully if found at an early stage?

And that cervical cancer is one of the most preventable cancers, with the HPV vaccination and new cervical screening test putting Australia on track to eliminate cervical cancer as a public health issue by 2035.

Detecting cancer early really does save lives. Join us to find out more about cancer screening and how you can reduce your risk.
