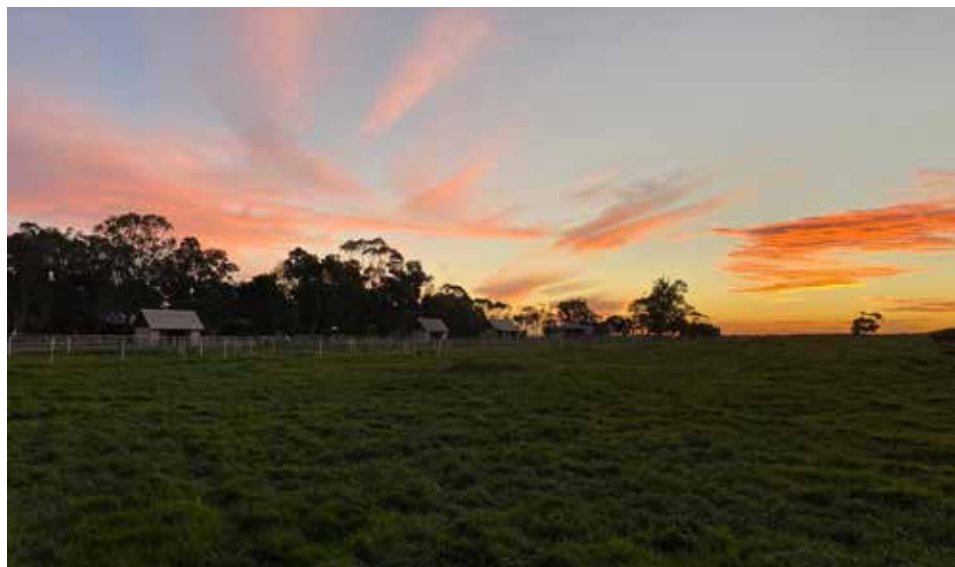

Lakewood Stud banner is reborn as Hickmott eyes the future

The rich history of the picturesque South Australian property will continue with young trainer and bloodstock agent setting up shop

One of South Australia's most historic farms - known at various times as Paumah Stud, Lakewood Stud, Rivers End Stud and Rosden Park, among others - has been rejuvenated as a training centre with prominent trainer and bloodstock agent Michael Hickmott

purchasing the property and incorporating the Wellington site into his operation.

The 800-acre property, situated on the banks of Lake Alexandrina near the mouth of the Murray River, came to prominence as Paumah Stud in the 1980s when administered by Florian and Marta Stumpf, before the couple sold the farm to Peter and Pauline Liston in 1998.

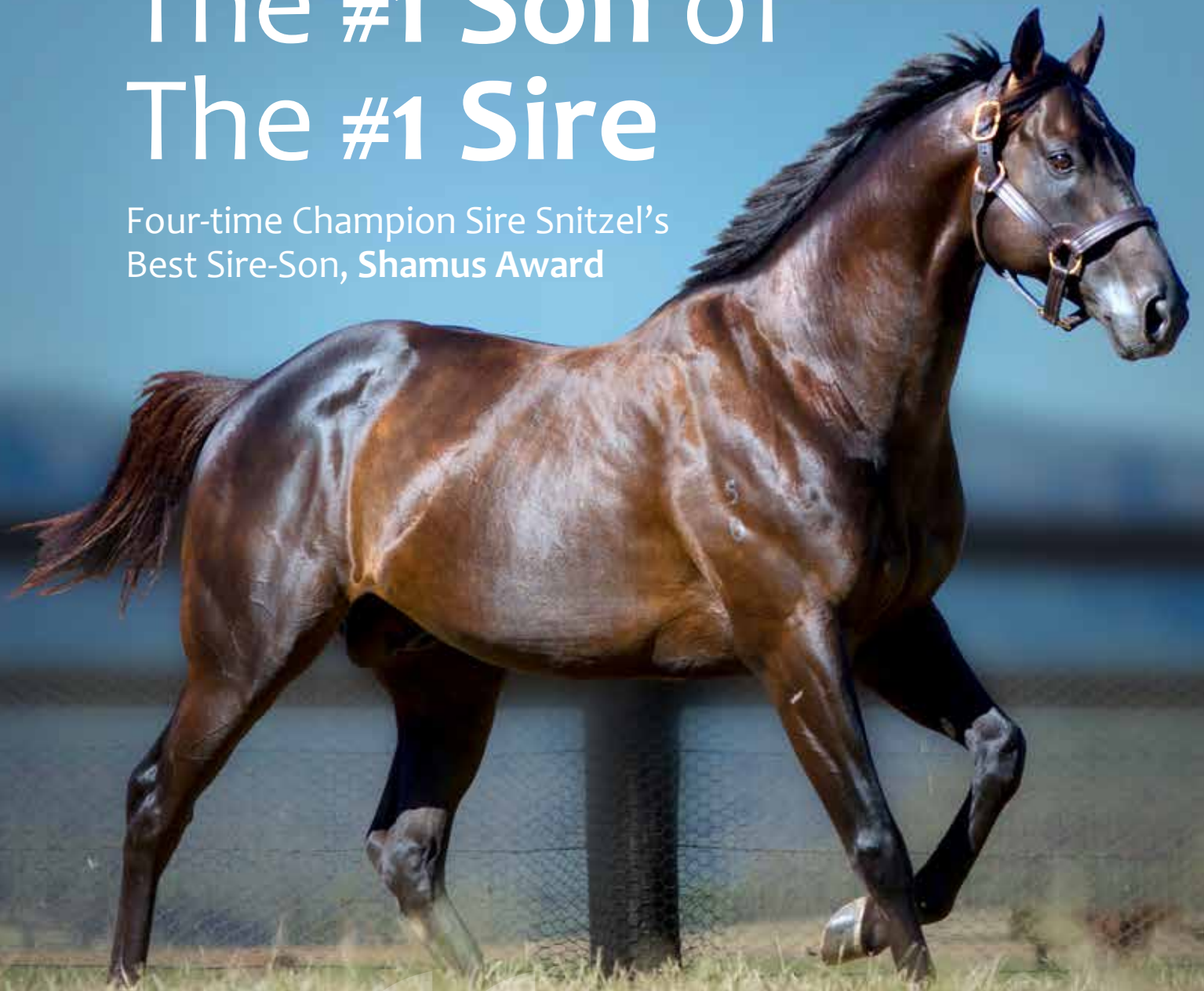

Renamed Lakewood Stud, it became one of South Australia's best-known breeding operations before the Listons moved back to Victoria to establish Three Bridges Thoroughbreds.

Purchased by Louie Elia in 2005, the property went through a quiet period as Rivers End Stud, although activity did increase in the years before it was sold to Brenton Scott in 2012. Its most recent iteration, under Scott's ownership, has been as Rosden Park, but Hickmott confirmed that the property would return to the Lakewood banner now that he and his wife Jade hold the keys.

"This is a property I admired and idolised from childhood, when it was under the ownership of Peter and Pauline Liston," Hickmott told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday. "You'd go to the stallion days and the open days and you'd just leave in awe. It's just a beautiful property."

"It has been under private ownership and operation now for the past decade or so. Unfortunately, it lost a little bit of its lustre right after the Listons left, but Brenton is a smart guy and he bought it, poking along with it. He's kept it as a private facility for the past eight years."

"It was at the Adelaide yearling sales last year that Brenton mentioned in passing to my wife and I that he'd consider selling it and we were delighted to work with him to secure the property. Pretty much, from there, my plan for the last 12 months has been making it happen, getting some more sales over the line and getting it all together."

The property, as it stands, boasts a fully-equipped training centre, agistment farm and stud complex. At Hickmott's disposal will be two training tracks, more than 50 boxes and irrigated spelling paddocks to accommodate more than 70 horses, and he is continuing to upgrade and expand the facilities at a rapid rate.

"So many of the best trainers around Australia are operating off their own properties," Hickmott said. "There is a real move away from metropolitan training centres and you only

<< Continued from page 3 need to have a look at how successful it has been in different parts of the country to see how beneficial it has been.

"The facilities that are there at the moment, there's a 1600-metre grass track, there's a 1500-metre sand track inside that, and I've recently put 3,500 tonnes of sand on there. Both of those are fully irrigated.

"There's a beautiful 28-horse barn and then there are two other 12-horse barns on site as well. There's approximately 200 acres of irrigated paddocks and I've just ordered another 22 horse rail yards for day yards out of which I'll train the horses. I've also got a brand new GG treadmill and walker being delivered next week.

"It's all pretty much there. The ability to have your own grass track and barriers and everything within 100 metres of my stables, everyone dreams of that."

The Lakewood operation will tie in with Hickmott's stables in Murray Bridge, about 20 kilometres north-west.

Hickmott has been based at Murray Bridge since returning to South Australia from the Northern Territory in 2011 and he says that the town, 75 kilometres south-east of Adelaide, is poised to become a major centre for thoroughbred racing, especially since the opening of the new Gifford Hill racecourse just over a year ago.

"It (Gifford Hill) is a fantastic track, it is an unbelievable surface to train on," Hickmott said. "I haven't got a single negative thing to say about that. I think TRSA (Thoroughbred Racing SA) need to continue to put money

into it like Racing Victoria have done with Ballarat and Cranbourne, and from there, I really think it's going to become a hive of activity. It's going to end up being the biggest asset to racing in South Australia, I think, and it needs to be considered that way and I'm sure that it will go forward.

"That said, no one is stabled on course at Gifford Hill at the moment, everyone is off course and it has been a real shambles. I'm lucky in that I own a really nice house and a brand new set of stables in Murray Bridge, I built them three years ago. I'll continue to use them because they are close to the course, and I'm going to use the facility at Lakewood to complement that and to work in with what I do.

"Mainly the stables here in Murray Bridge will be for the younger horses. The long-term plan is that, when they get this development up and going, I will build stables on course at Murray Bridge and sell the house and stables."

While Lakewood will offer the opportunity for rapid expansion should Hickmott choose to chase it, he is more comfortable with remaining a smaller operation in order to maintain his hands-on approach with his horses.

"I have 30 in work at the moment, with the farm I will probably increase that to 40 but I still want to keep it as a relatively boutique operation. I want to be very hands-on and visual with the horses," he said.

"I've got 60 horses on agistment at Lakewood at the moment, of which I think 45 or 46 of them are mine Continued on page 7>>

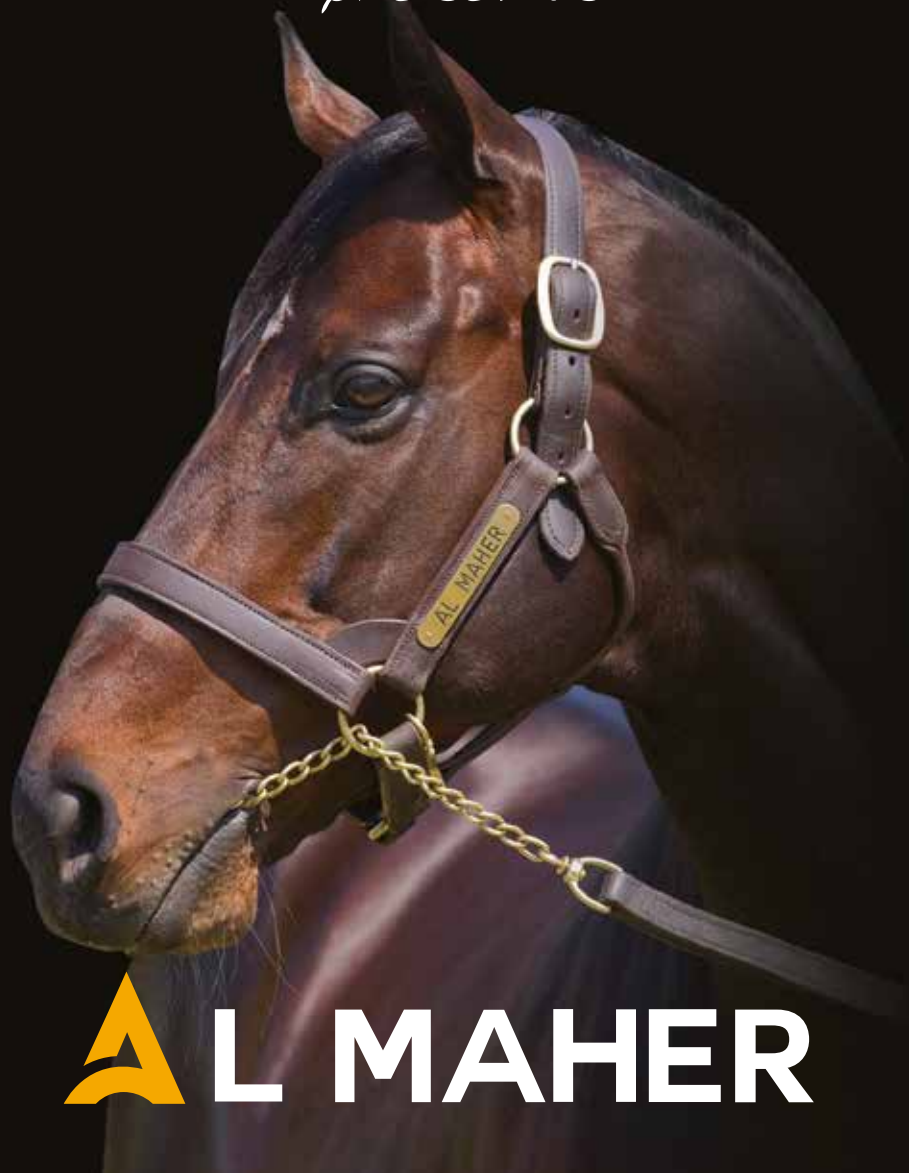

<< Continued from page 5 to come into work. They range from recently turned three-year-olds and two-year-olds down to some younger yearlings who are just starting to arrive now.

"I like that side of it and we're going to continue to grow the farm and really spend a lot of time and money to improve the facilities. I can see us getting more horses and maybe that will see us increase the number we have in work."

While Hickmott is now in possession of one of the leading South Australian nurseries of the last half-century, he says it is highly unlikely that stallions will return to the farm that was once the home of the likes of Bellotto (Mr Prospector), Happy Giggle (Rory's Jester) and Clangalang (Clang).

"I think it's just something where you stick to what you know best," Hickmott said. "I would love to develop a stallion one day and hopefully, from there, he'd end up at Newgate Farm or somewhere like that. I have a great relationship with Henry (Field) so that would be a dream.

"If I did something like that, I might have a stallion at Lakewood on my own, just to breed to a few mares. Maybe I'd look at doing that with some staying mares, just as a hobby or an interest, but certainly it's not the plan to operate commercially."

Horses and houses combine for Hickmott

Hickmott, who followed his father John and his brother Robert into the training ranks in the days after he turned 18 in August, 2006, mixed horses with houses early in his career, working as a real estate consultant and an auctioneer in Darwin while maintaining a string of thoroughbreds.

That business nous has paid dividends with the acquisition of

what he calls his "dream property" - although it hasn't been the most straightforward path.

"To be 100 per cent honest, the last four or five years I've been in a building phase," Hickmott said. "That has been purely based around the fact that I wanted to buy property, although never in my wildest dreams did I think that my dream property would become available and it has.

"Every decent horse or young horse I've had, I've sold. I've been selling horses for other people, for other owners, getting them ready and getting commission. My whole model has been based around selling horses. The horses that I've been racing for the last few seasons have been the second hand horses, the horses that were left over or the horses that people had sent me to patch up and keep going."

His rise to success - in the equine world, at least - began before his 19th birthday arrived a year later, winning the first of his three Darwin Cups (2000m) with General Market (Flying Spur). Two years later, classy stayer Activation (Zabeel) would give him a second win in the Top End's biggest race, before he would return to Darwin to score with Canny Ballad (Dream Ballad) in 2016.

In recent months, Hickmott - who turned 32 earlier this week - has hit a purple patch of form. Of his last 50 runners, he has had 13 winners, while four of his last seven runners have been successful, including promising staying prospect Tibetan (Shocking) at Gawler on Wednesday.

What is notable is that more horses are heading to Hickmott as a destination, rather than as a stepping stone to Asia or to other stables in Sydney or Melbourne. The trainer believes that the Lakewood acquisition will only help those who entrust their horses to him.

<< Continued from page 7 some horses in South Australia at the moment is that the cost base is fantastic and people will still like to race horses locally," he said.

"In saying that, I've got a lot of clients who are based in New Zealand and Hong Kong, because they see the benefits of still being able to race in Melbourne from an Adelaide base while not paying the Melbourne fees. The Hong Kong guys like it because it's less costly for them and they are still getting the same job done.

"At the moment, too, I'm finding that there is really strong demand for the mum and dad owners, the five per cent shareholders. I think we've put four or five horses in the last couple of weeks; Shane Adair, who is a good mate of mine, he's been helping with that as I just haven't had the time with the farm. Now I've got someone who is helping with that side of things, we're continuing to grow that very quickly.

"I had very limited stabling so that's held me back, but it worked for what we were trying to achieve. The last couple of years, I've got some more stables, I'm renting some other stables at the moment as well and we're increasing the numbers. We're just starting to see those horses coming through as the three- and the four-year-olds now and I think we'll only continue to grow and thrive from there.

With all the pieces coming together sweetly, Hickmott - who at 32 has already achieved more than many trainers achieve in a lifetime - now has his sights set on taking his business to the next level.

"In terms of having a million winners or huge stakes success, it probably hasn't been a significant achievement, but it's been big in terms of achieving what I've wanted so far," he said.

"The last few years have been focused on developing a business and looking to purchase my own property and running my own race rather than renting stables my whole life. The big goal for me, now that we've purchased this property, is to really develop it and turn it back into the showpiece property that it was.

"Now that we've got that and I've got such good facilities, I would really like to start being able to have more runners and have more success from that point of view, while still being able to function and support my clients who have supported me throughout - for example, the guys from Hong Kong and New Zealand.

"It's just going to allow me to expand in general and to continue to develop my business, while still being able to do it properly. All the money that we are spending on the farm at the moment is all back into the facilities, trying to provide the best possible operation for my horses and my clients."

100 for Savabeel

It was a milestone day at Hawkesbury for champion Waikato Stud stallion Savabeel (Zabeel) as he sired his 100th individual stakes winner when Savacool (6 m ex Chilled Out by Anabaa) took out yesterday's Rowley Mile (Listed, 1600m). The Chris Waller-trained mare, who has been placed at stakes level four times, stormed home down the middle of the track to defeat Girl Tuesday (Street Cry) by half a length with Spencer (Pierro) a nose away in third. Purchased by her trainer for NZ\$220,000 at the 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale, Savacool is one of five winners from six to race out of unraced mare Chilled Out (Anabaa), who herself is a half-sister to Group 1 placed sprinter The Big Chill (O'Reilly). Savabeel, who has been the leading sire by earnings in New Zealand for the last six years, stands at Waikato for a fee of NZ\$100,000 (plus GST) this season.

Stellar Pauline sheds maiden tag

Earlier on the Hawkesbury card, three-year-old filly Stellar Pauline (Not A Single Doubt) landed a long awaited win in an 1100-metre maiden. Trained by Peter and Paul Snowden, the \$875,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale Purchase finished second in her first four starts, including in the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on debut, the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) and in the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). Settling on the rails just behind the leader, Stellar Pauline kicked clear in the straight to score by two and a quarter lengths ahead of Not Another Reiby (Denman).

Aquis sells back Free Of Debt share

Aquis have sold back their share in Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) third Free Of Debt (Unencumbered) after the four-year-old was gelded. The operation bought into the then two-year-old colt as a stallion prospect after winning his first two races, but a decline in form has led Aquis to part ways with him and Chris Bieg to have him gelded. "Unfortunately, after a bright start with Aquis when he ran third in the Blue Diamond, things have gone pear shaped with trying to make him a stallion prospect," Bieg told Racing.com. "His subsequent six runs after the Diamond yielded just one placing when he ran second to Super Seth in the Manfred Stakes at Caulfield. After his last run in Brisbane in late May when he only beat a couple home the tough call was made to geld him. For Aquis that was not the business model they were obviously pursuing when they bought into the horse and they elected to sell him back."

Thompson's spring dream team taking shape

John Thompson is assembling a strong team for the Sydney carnival headed by Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock), who will resume in a glorious edition of the Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m). His support cast of stablemates this spring include two-time stakes winner Sweet Deal (Casino Prince), who resumes in tomorrow's Toy Show Quality (Gr 3, 1100m), while Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) placegetter Mamaragan (Wandjina) and the progressive Fituese (Deep Field) make their returns in the coming weeks. "It's a good position to be in for a small to medium sized stable to have a few bullets to fire in the big races coming up," Thompson said. Regarding Dreamforce's chances he added: "Nash (Rawiller)

came and galloped him on Tuesday, he knows the horse really well and he said he's never felt better."

Winter find set to Show up in stakes test

Brad Widdup has a handy band of progressive mares on his books and hopes that two of them can make winning returns at Randwick tomorrow with Icebath (Sacred Falls) set to contest a benchmark race, while Adelong (Medaglia D'Oro) lines up in the Toy Show Quality (Gr 3, 1100m). A winner of six of her eight starts, Adelong shapes as a black-type mare and is a clear favourite to land her first stakes win in the Toy Show. While the five-year-old has residual fitness from her recent campaign and the benefit of a barrier trial, Widdup said she is hard to get a guide on at home. "One day she will work brilliant, the next day she will work like she can't win a maiden," Widdup said. "She is a bit tricky that way but she normally turns up and races well and I'm really happy with how she looks. She has her summer coat and she's in excellent order."

Jungle's wet track edge back at Valley

Mick Bell believes the decision to scratch his stable stalwart Jungle Edge (Dubawi) at Caulfield last weekend was the correct one as the gelding heads into tomorrow's Carlyon Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Moonee Valley. He said Jungle Edge will be suited by the soft track and the predicted rain. "I think he'll run really well. I'm not saying he's going to win but it's going to take a good horse to beat him," he said. Bell said the four weeks between runs also suits the veteran gelding. "He went really well in a jump out the previous Monday at Cranbourne, although Bons Away, who is in the same race, went pretty well also in the same jump out," Bell said.

Alfa Oro scratched

Matt Laurie has opted to scratch up and coming sprinter Alfa Oro (Bachelor Duke) from tomorrow's Carlyon Stakes after the gelding pulled up poorly from a track gallop earlier this week. "He's too promising and (it) needs some investigation," Laurie told Racing.com.

Pike confident in Windstorm

William Pike is confident WA gelding Windstorm (Redoute's Choice), who is the stablemate of last weekend's Caulfield winner Showmanship (Showcasing), can kick off his Victorian campaign with a win when he partners him in the 4 Pines Refreshing Ale Handicap (1200m) at Moonee Valley tomorrow. "I hope he comes out with a similar performance to Showmanship," Pike told Racing.com. "Similar to how I felt with Showmanship, I'm very confident in his ability but they do have to come over and travel and have a start and show it. But he's a good horse, his record speaks for itself, he's gone through his grades with ease. If half of him shows up he'll go very well. He's a bit different to Showmanship, Showmanship is very laid back and the cruisiest dude in the world, whereas Windstorm's a little bit more highly strung."

Widgee to bounce back

After a disappointing run in the Aurie's Star Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) last start, Patrick Payne is confident Widgee Turf (Turffontein) can bounce back at Moonee Valley tomorrow. "I thought he was plain as paper in the Aurie's Star, we were expecting a bit more from him," Payne told Racing.com. "The race wasn't run to suit and I think he'll get every chance this weekend, the step up in trip will really suit. He'll love getting his toe in the ground and while he's only had the one race he has been up for a while as we were looking for these wet tracks to suit so I'm expecting it to all work in his favour this weekend."

Forster weighs up jockey options for Eelloh

Desleigh Forster is mulling over a rider replacement for Eelloh (Better Than Ready) at Doomben following an injury to regular jockey Taylor Marshall. Marshall suffered three broken ribs when his mount Topline (Top

Echelon) played up in the barriers at Ipswich on Wednesday. The horse became cast before being withdrawn on veterinary advice. "It's a real shame for Taylor because he's been on a roll lately, but he's still young so hopefully he'll heal quickly," Forster said. Jim Byrne and Mark Du Plessis, who have ridden extensively for Forster in the past, are among the front-runners to gain the ride on Eelloh in tomorrow's TAB Long May We Play Handicap (1600m).

Gytrash to trial at Warwick Farm

Everest (1200m) contender Gytrash (Lope De Vega) has arrived in Sydney and will have the first trial of his campaign at Warwick Farm this morning. The sprinter will be the headline act when he steps out in an 800-metre heat alongside the Joe Pride-trained Fasika (So You Think), who is in the mix to earn an Everest slot. Jason Collett has been booked to ride Gytrash in The Everest and he will put the horse through his paces at Warwick Farm.

Santa pleases in trial

Sam Freedman, who trains in partnership with his father Anthony, was pleased with the performance of multiple Group 1 winner Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega) in the first trial of his campaign at Sandown yesterday. "Santa was having his first hit-out for this preparation but he was really good," Sam Freedman told Racing.com. "We were probably expecting him to trial a little worse than he did because it was pretty soft ground out there and he's never been a flash trialler early in his preparation. Mark (Zahra) rode him and said the further they were going, the more he wanted to keep trucking into it. He's got a while still to his first-up assignment so he'll have at least one more hit-out, maybe even two."

Feehan for Mahamedeis

Nick Ryan's consistent gelding Mahamedeis (Magnus) will again target the Feehan Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) after running second in the race last year. "We will look to run him fresh in the Feehan Stakes at Moonee Valley," Ryan told Racing.com. "But where we go after that in the spring, there's a few options he could take. We will let him tell us. There's three or four different paths he can take, we've mapped out a few paths and it will be about how he is going and we will decide on the way."

Freeman nearing return

Robert Hickmott reports Django Freeman (Campanologist) to be in fine form ahead of the stakes winner's intended return to action next month. The German import was last seen finishing third in a handicap over 2040 metres at Moonee Valley in June and Hickmott has pencilled in a 1700-metre handicap at that track on September 12 for the colt's starting point. "There's a bit of hardness about him and we're very happy with his progress for sure," Hickmott told Racing.com. "He will be ready to win first-up, I would suggest. He will have enough work under him. We will get him to the Turnbull and then he will tell us which way we go whether it's Cups or Cox Plate, Mackinnon."

Vale Delicacy

Racenet yesterday reported that dual Group 1 winner Delicacy (Al Maher) died suddenly after suffering an allergic reaction to penicillin. The nine-year-old mare, who was in foal to Pierro (Lonhro) when she died, was trained by Grant Williams in Perth and won 12 races from 19 starts, including the 2015 Schweppes Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) and South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m).

Internationals likely for spring

The path for a European challenge to aim at this year's Melbourne Spring Carnival appeared to be cleared yesterday when Racing Australia revealed that travel exemptions for some international staff had already been approved. It had been feared that if stable staff were unable to travel only horses on a one-way ticket likely to make the journey. However, RA's acting chief executive Myles Foreman said yesterday that progress had been made in dealings with the Australian Border Force which would enable staff to travel with their horses. "They (travel exemptions) are starting to flow through so for all intents and purposes, things are flowing, albeit with an extra couple of hoops to jump through," Foreman told Racing.com. "There's movement and obviously there is no issue with the movement of the horses, but we need the people to go with the horses and we are progressing well at this stage and we've actually had some travel exemptions approved. If we continue to get those and meet the right criteria, there is no reason why we cannot proceed on the basis that we've got stable staff able to come out with careful management around the 14 days quarantine."

OTI represented at home and abroad

The OTI Racing colours of navy blue, gold and white will be carried by 11 runners in four different countries this weekend, many with an eye on Australia's spring riches. On the home front, Young Rascal (Intello) will have his first run for Archie Alexander when he steps out in a 2040-metre quality handicap at Moonee Valley as he plots a path towards the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m). He will be joined at the Melbourne track by Tigre Royale (Redwood), who will attempt to make it five in a row when he steps out in a Benchmark 78, as well as former Irish sprinter-miler Never No More (No Nay Never) and French-Swedish import Barade (Havana Gold). Abroad, Ebor Handicap (1m 6f) runner True Self (Oscar) and Prix Kergorlay (Gr 2, 3000m) contender San Huberto (Speightstown) will put their Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) credentials on the line, while Italian Oaks (Gr 2, 2200m) heroine Auyantepui (Night Of

Thunder) - a new recruit - will contest the Prix de la Nonette (Gr 2, 2000m) at Deauville and Camphor (Camelot) will run in the Stanerra Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 6f) at Naas.

Parr back on course after illness scare

Josh Parr will make his long-awaited return to Sydney racing tomorrow with four rides, including one of his favourite horses Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt) in the Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m). Parr was sidelined in May when he was diagnosed with brachial neuritis, an uncommon affliction characterised by severe pain and loss of function in some nerves. He had his first race ride at Newcastle two weeks ago in what he labelled "the big test" and came through it with flying colours. Parr took last weekend off to ensure his arm still felt strong and was due to ride at Thursday's Rowley Mile meeting at Hawkesbury until his mounts were scratched. Parr said of his intended ride on Quackerjack: "He's up against the best horses going around at the moment and he's going to have to produce a very good performance but as far as we can see he's in good shape."

Currie wins appeal

Former Queensland trainer Ben Currie has had a 30-month ban for a supposed intention to use an electronic apparatus overturned. In a statement issued yesterday Queensland Racing Integrity Commission said: "The Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal (QCAT) has accepted an appeal from former Toowoomba trainer Ben Currie and ruled that Ben Currie did not breach AR175(a) setting aside the internal review decision of June 7, 2019. Queensland Racing Integrity Commission (QRIC) stewards found Mr Currie guilty in May, 2019 of engaging in an improper action following an investigation into text messages relating to the intention to use an electronic apparatus capable of affecting the performance of two horses. The internal review decision which confirmed the stewards' decision has been set aside." Currie, who was initially banned for four years before having his penalty reduced to 30 months on appeal, does not currently hold a training licence.

Mithen calls for border reopening

Prominent Victorian owner and breeder Anthony Mithen has called for a change in the rules of the NSW-imposed border closure which prevents horses crossing into the state to race - even though broodmares are allowed to make the same journey for the breeding season. "Racing Australia is our regulatory body from a breeding perspective here so they are a different regulatory body to Racing NSW, but how they can have such vastly different protocols in terms of horse movement over the border is beyond me," Mithen told Racing.com. "The frustration is coming to bear from some of the breeding and racing set-ups that are frustrated at the fact there is seemingly one set of rules for Racing NSW but Racing Australia are adopting a more practical approach and setting in place protocols. Why are we allowed to get mares there, but we can't get racehorses there? This needs to come to a head."

Racing Queensland hails return for Queensland participants

Racing Queensland (RQ) will deliver a profit for the last financial year despite the Covid-19 pandemic, with the governing body announcing yesterday that it had delivered record-breaking returns to its participants. RQ yesterday said that returns had grown by 9.6 per cent to \$222.5 million across all three codes, with wagering on Queensland races also reaching a new high of \$4.8 billion. "The 2019/20 financial year has been extraordinary in more ways than one," RQ chairman Steve Wilson said. "Ahead of tabling my fifth annual report, we are pleased with the manner in which the industry's 40,000 participants have galvanised together to continue to race amidst a global pandemic which has changed our very way of life. We're also grateful for the ongoing support of the Palaszczuk government. While Racing Queensland enjoyed some irregular wagering growth at the backend of FY20, we have also made a concerted effort to be relentless in our commercial pursuits including non-TAB to TAB conversions, race field fees and programming choices. As a result, we will be in a position to announce a modest profit in the FY20 Annual Report, but the job is far from done."

Tabcorp to raise \$600 million in equity

The Covid-19 pandemic has hit wagering giant Tabcorp hard, announcing earlier this week that it had recorded an annual loss across its group of \$870 million, compounded by the forced closure of pubs, clubs and betting outlets, as well as the suspension of racing and sports operations across the world. This was after Tabcorp announced a \$361 million profit in the 2018-19 financial year. Wagering earnings fell 19.5 per cent year-on-year, reaching \$371 million, while full-year revenue across the board was down 4.8 per cent to \$5.22 billion. The company's wagering and media unit was also the subject of a \$1.1 billion writedown. As a result of uncertainty in the months to come, the company will raise \$600 million in equity at a price of \$3.25 per share.

NEW ZEALAND

NZB to unveil new bidding technology

New Zealand Bloodstock (NZB) have announced the development of a new online bidding platform specifically developed for the future of their thoroughbred and standardbred auction sales. After introducing market-leading technology into the digital auction-sphere four years ago via popular online subsidiary gavelhouse.com, NZB has now been able to adapt the technology to be used extensively during their upcoming physical sales. The development of the advanced bidding module is underway and will be tested extensively prior to debuting at NZB's Ready to Run Sale of Two Year Olds in November. "With the upgrade to ultra-fast fibre at Karaka, we are now in the position to offer online bidding services for registered buyers who are unable to physically attend our auctions," bloodstock sales manager Danny Rolston said. "We know this platform is robust and it's going to be really easy to use for customers, during what is a critical time due to the global pandemic."

Waikato stallion parade cancelled

The gavelhouse.com Waikato Branch New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders Association

stallion parade planned for this weekend has been cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions. "It's unfortunate for the Waikato Branch who have put so much effort into this tour, but we cannot risk up to 100 people going around the Waikato from farm to farm under the current Covid-19 restrictions," NZTBA chief executive Justine Sclater said. "The breeding season is due to start next week and with the virus so far being contained in Auckland it would be foolhardy to risk jeopardising that by having the public parade. Under Level Two the breeding season should be able to go ahead normally, and we would encourage people to make private arrangements with the farms to view their stallions, under circumstances where masks are worn, social distancing is maintained and contact tracing in place."

Sherrif targets Livamol Classic

Talented six-year-old Sherrif (High Chaparral) returns tomorrow on a journey that could yet see him tackle the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) at Hastings on October 17. The starting point is the Colchester Engineering 1400 at Matamata, a race where the gelding will be confronted with a heavy track and 62 kilograms to carry. Despite those unfavourable factors, co-trainer Roger James is happy with Sherrif's fitness and overall condition. "I've been really happy with him. He's a horse who has always shown me well above average ability. He's well capable of winning a really nice race, hopefully even in Australia eventually, though that won't be until the autumn at the earliest. But we're hoping he can tell us that's the level he should be competing at. He's in a favourable place in the handicaps now. We're hoping he can get into the field for the (Livamol Classic) on the last day at Hastings but he'll be well-placed in the handicaps for those middle distance Cups races too."

Three for Golden Horn

Darley's Golden Horn (Cape Cross) sired his third individual stakes winner when Gold Wand (3 f ex Los Ojitos by Mr Greeley) took out yesterday's Sir Henry Cecil Galtres Stakes

(Listed, 1m 4f) at York. Trained by Roger Varian, the three-year-old filly followed up her second in a Listed race here last time out when beating the staying on Vivionn (Dubawi) by a length and three-quarters. Award Scheme (Siyouni) was another who was doing her best work late on, finishing another length and a quarter away in third. Gold Wand, now the winner of two of her five starts, is the second foal out of the US stakes-placed mare Los Ojitos (Mr Greeley). Golden Horn stood for £40,000 (approx AUD\$73,50) at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in 2020.

The dual Classic heroine added the Yorkshire Oaks title to her impressive victories in the 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) and Epsom Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) when beating Alpinista (Frankel) by an eased down five lengths under a hands and heels ride from Ryan Moore. One Voice (Poet's Voice) was a further two lengths adrift in a stretched out field. "I remember riding her as a two-year-old and I thought she was exceptional," said Moore after this latest triumph. "This year she has thrived and got stronger and she has done that very easy." Winning trainer Aidan O'Brien told ITV Racing after the race that the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) in Paris in early October will be next on the agenda for the six-time-winner. She is as short as 6-4 to provide O'Brien with a third win in that race, following his victories with Dylan Thomas (Daneshill) and Found (Galileo).

Grade 1 winning sire Sir Prancealot (Tamayuz) will stand at Cornerstone in South Australia for a reduced fee of \$9,900 (inc GST) in 2020.

Arqana brings forward Select Sale

Arqana has brought next month's Select Sale forward by more than a fortnight to between September 8 and 10 inclusive as a response to the recently implemented Covid-19 quarantine restrictions. Star mare Atlantic Jewel dies after giving birth to Justify foal

Multiple Group 1 winner Atlantic Jewel (Fastnet Rock) died at Coolmore's farm in Australia last night after giving birth to a foal by the brilliant US Triple Crown winner Justify (Scat Daddy).

The winner of ten of her 11 starts in a career which saw her amass over \$1.5 million in prize-money with victories in the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) in 2011, the following year's All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m), and then the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in 2013, Atlantic Jewel suffered a fatal haemorrhage. The colt foal survived.

Breaking the news, Coolmore Australia's Tom Moore told ANZ Bloodstock News: "Sadly we lost the brilliant Atlantic Jewel last night when she haemorrhaged after foaling. It is very sad news but she did leave behind a cracking Justify colt who is doing well."

Purchased by Coolmore for \$320,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in 2010, Atlantic Jewel was sired by Coolmore's champion sire Fastnet Rock (Danehill), out of the winning Zabeel (Sir Tristram) mare Regard.

Following her glittering racing career, Atlantic Jewel embarked on her career as a broodmare where her five coverings by multiple European champion Galileo produced three offspring of racing age. They included

the stakes performer Pacific Ocean, a winner in Ireland for Aidan O'Brien, and stablemate Russian Emperor, successful in the Hampton Court Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 2f) at Royal Ascot in June before finishing in midfield in last month's Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f).

The duo carried the colours of Laurie Macri, which Atlantic Jewel herself sported to so much success in her esteemed racing career in the care of Mark Kavanagh.

Finalists announced for New Zealand Thoroughbred Horse Of The Year Awards

The high quality of New Zealand's three-year-old crop last season is illustrated by the finalists for the Champion Three-Year-Old category at the NZ Thoroughbred Horse of the Year Awards.

Eight horses, including five fillies, are finalists in the three-year-old division, which will provide the voting panel with plenty to mull over.

Seven of the eight contenders won a Group 1 race in the 2019-20 season and between them the finalists recorded 29 wins and 29 placings from 67 starts.

The Kiwi three-year-olds made a mark on both sides of the Tasman, with Probabeel (Savabeel) and Quick Thinker (So You Think) winning Group 1 races at the Sydney autumn carnival. Quick Thinker became the fifth New Zealand-trained winner of the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) in the past eight years.

Two Illicit (Jimmy Choux), who never finished further back than third, did not win a Group 1 race but still presented a compelling case to be a finalist. The filly won two Group 2 races, including a runaway victory in the Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m), and finished a brave second in the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m).

In a rare situation, Te Akau's Jamie Richards is the sole nomination for Trainer of the Year, after experiencing an extraordinary season that included 11 Group 1 wins and more than NZ\$7 million in stakes.

The Te Akau stable will be represented by five of the 20 individual horses who will be finalists in the flat racing categories. Cool Aza Beel (Savabeel), Probabeel, Advantage (Fastnet Rock), Melody Belle (Commands) and Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) will fly the flag for Te Akau, with Melody Belle and Advantage nominated in two categories.

switched on the afterburners, putting a margin on her rivals before holding them at bay to score by two lengths.

While it may have been a shock to the market, Bella Nipotina managed to justify the faith of her co-trainers Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes with her dominant effort.

"She has been a very unlucky horse in her races to date, she has been knocked off by some really nice horses," Hayes said. "Off her trials it looked like she had really improved but we weren't sure.

"We were going to go to a maiden but she trialled so well so we changed plans and we went here to go to a stakes race so it was a very good decision. It was a huge result."

A veteran of rich races, predominantly stakes events, as a two-year-old, the Lindsay Park filly had not performed poorly by any stretch of the imagination as a juvenile.

Beaten a head in both the \$500,000 Inglis Banner (RL, 1000m) at Moonee Valley and the \$2 million Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m) at Warwick Farm, she was also fourth twice at Group level in the Blue Diamond Preview (Gr 3, 1000m) for the fillies and the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m).

(Notably, Sweet Embrace runner-up Stellar Pauline (Not A Single Doubt), who was also competitive without winning at two, broke her maiden yesterday at Hawkesbury.)

Bred by Michael Christian's Saconi Thoroughbreds, Bella Nipotina is the first foal out of Bella Orfana (Star Witness), a Geelong placegetter in her short racing career.

The filly now named Bella Nipotina fetched \$80,000 at Book 1 of the 2019 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale from the draft of Rosemont

Stud. Acquiring her was a joint bid from Lindsay Park, Mt Hallowell Stud - in whose colours she races - and Andrew Williams Bloodstock.

Bella Orfana's second foal, a filly by Capitalist (Written Tycoon), was passed in for \$100,000 at Melbourne Premier this year; the mare is due to foal down to Trapeze Artist (Snitzel) later this year.

Bella Nipotina boasts an all-Australian pedigree, stretching back eight generations on her dam's side.

Her second dam Bella Inez (Beautiful Crown) was a sister to Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Golden Rose (1400m) hero In Top Swing, while in the breeding barn, she has been a prolific producer.

In addition to Bella Orfana, her four foals included Group 2 winner Hallowell Belle (Starcraft), who raced in the same Mt Hallowell Stud colours as Bella Nipotina, and Group 3 victor Fuddle Dee Duddle (Red Ransom).

Victory was a long time coming for Bella Nipotina (Pride Of Dubai) and it seemed certain to arrive at any moment.

When it did happen, though, it seems that it came as a shock to most people.

Sent off as 20-1 chance in what looked a strong running of the Quezette Stakes (Group 3, 1100m) Bella Nipotina was one of a trio of leaders in the early stages.

Travelling strongly throughout, she never really looked in doubt once rider Michael Rodd

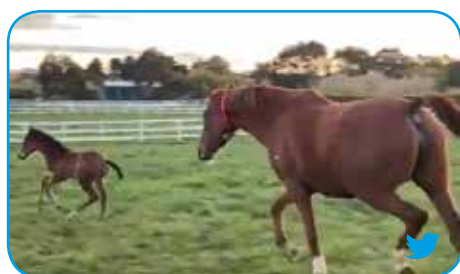
